



Actions of Centre for Disability in Development (CDD)

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SDG (Sustainable Development Goals):

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a collection of 17 global goals set by the United Nations. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) also known as the Global Goals for working universally to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that all people enjoy peace and prosperity. The total number of targets is 169. The SDGs are also known as "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development" or Agenda 2030 in short. The goals were developed to replace the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) which ended in 2015. The SDG framework does not distinguish between "developed" and "developing" nations. Instead, the goals apply to all countries

Centre of Disability in Development (CDD)

CDD is working since 1996 for an inclusive society for persons with disabilities in Bangladesh. The vision of CDD is "Equal opportunities and full participation for persons with disabilities in all spheres of life". CDD believes that, all development actors should mainstream disability issues and make their organizational environment and programs disability inclusive. Barriers within society that limit inclusion of persons with disabilities need to be removed. At the same time persons with disabilities must have access to rehabilitation services and their capacity adequately built. This will encourage participation of persons with disabilities to be meaningful, respectful and dignified. CDD strongly believes that to ensure sustainability of any initiative, it is imperative to engage constructively with the local government institutes, the national government, the development NGOs, community and most significantly the persons with disabilities, their families, groups and organizations.

After successful adaptation of MDG, Bangladesh is moving for SDG. For achieving the targets of SDG, Bangladesh government is working on several actions and programs to ensure participation of all. Among them, persons with disabilities are also considered for the ultimate

objective of the targets of SDG. CDD is working both nationally at strategic level and also locally at implementing level. At strategic level CDD is providing technical support to state and non-state actors to incorporate disability issues and at locally CDD is working with several partner NGOs to include disability issues in mainstream development and to enable persons with disabilities to obtain equal opportunities and full participation. Strategic plan of CDD for next 5 years is in line with commitments to *'leave no one behind'* of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development which makes explicit reference to the imperativeness to include persons with disabilities. Besides, CDD is also considering national and international documents like UNCRPD (UN Convention on the Rights of persons with Disabilities), UDHR (Universal declaration of Human Rights), CBR (Community Based Rehabilitation guidelines), etc.
